

- **Funding Request:** Motion made by Jeneva Martinez with a second by Sonia Bolaños to send the Road2Recovery request for \$263 for liability insurance to the board for approval. Road2Recovery had 35 participants last year and is scheduled for January 24, 2026 – 10am at the Woolbowl.

#### **HEALTH COUNCIL ACTIVITIES**

- **FY26 CCHC PROPOSAL** - Motion made by Jeneva Martinez with a second by Sonia Bolaños to accept the proposal as written. Members are encouraged to join subcommittees to help with accomplishing the proposal goals.
- **Behavioral Health & Wellness** – The behavioral health and wellness subcommittee provided an update on their public survey results and coordination with the administrative office of the courts. The next behavioral health meeting was scheduled for September 17th at 8 AM. Links to zoom can be found on website.
- **Youth Education & Awareness** - ZAG Youth Business Fair is scheduled for Oct 25<sup>th</sup> from 10am-2pm at ENMMC. Total of 19 youth participants pitched their business plans to the “shark tank”. They were awarded a total of \$1450 in start-up funds. Ages ranged from 8-17.
- **Together with Veterans** – Next meeting is scheduled for October 18<sup>th</sup> and will continue to plan the Stand Down scheduled for February 6, 2026 from 9am – 6pm with location TBD. QPR training is scheduled for November 15<sup>th</sup> at American Legion Post 28.
- **FY25 ANNUAL REPORT** - First annual report was presented to the membership

#### **PRESENTATIONS – Food Insecurity and Education**

Jocelyn Smith discussed Food Not Bombs' operations, including their free food distribution on Thursdays and Sundays, food rescue programs, and efforts to connect with veterans and other organizations. She highlighted their need for volunteers, storage space, and partnerships with schools and businesses.

Becky Joyce and Paula Camp shared their initiative's work in providing healthy food options for children in Chaves County, emphasizing the importance of nutrition for school performance and overall well-being. Healthy Kids program's initiatives to promote healthy eating and physical activity among elementary students in Chavez County. The program, which operates in multiple schools including Roswell, Dexter, Hagerman, and Lake Arthur, implements the 5-2-1-0 challenge and conducts cooking classes, tastings, and gardening projects. The discussion highlighted successful gardening programs at various schools, including Pecos Elementary's carrot harvest project and Lake Arthur's community garden, while noting challenges such as water access during summer months. The conversation ended with a discussion about potential partnerships with the Department of Health for nutrition education programs, particularly regarding diabetes prevention and cooking classes.

Alianza created a food calendar and CCHC will be adding it with additional Valley resources to the website. There is also a need for more food distribution sites, especially for after-hours and weekend access. The group also talked about a new Amazon-style refrigerated box system for food pickup and possible delivery. Roadrunner Foodbank has capacity building funds.
